

#### **Dental Health Matters**

There is a chronic shortage of NHS Dentists and people are suffering health issues as a result. The NFWI calls on the Government to increase investment in the training and retention of dentists and to review the current inadequate NHS contracts in order to ensure everyone can access an NHS dentist wherever they live.

Members now have the opportunity to learn more about the issues, and to discuss the resolution in their WIs before deciding how their delegate should vote at the Annual Meeting.

NFWI will be holding an online meeting on 24 April. To register for the event go to MyWI.

All WIs get one vote- for or against the resolution. This must be done at your April/May meeting.

WIs may choose to give their link delegate discretion to decide how to vote after hearing the speakers and the debate at the Annual Meeting.

#### GREEN CORNER—The Call of the Curlew

Once upon a time, the sound of the curlews returning to their breeding sites was a welcome reminder that spring was on the way in Herefordshire. But no more. If you've lived here long enough, you'll know that curlews were once widespread across the landscape but their numbers have declined dramatically. The only reason we still have any in the county is because they are long lived birds. Those that are left are not producing enough young to maintain their numbers.

As ground nesting birds their eggs are very vulnerable to predation, both by mammals and birds. Without fencing, most nests are predated before the eggs even hatch and sadly, in the last couple of years, we know of only one pair that have managed to rear fully fledged chicks. As curlews will almost always come back to the same site to breed year after year, once a pair die that's it - those fields will remain empty – no new birds will replace them unless they've been able to fledge chicks. Curlews are in trouble and they need help.

The first step is making sure we know where they all are – so, if you hear or see curlews anywhere in the county, please do let us know. They have a very distinctive call – you'll hear it in the background of many radio and TV programmes but go to https://www.british-birdsongs.uk/curlew/ for a quick refresher.

# Aston Ingham WI At our meeting on 11th March, 2024 Andrew

At our meeting on 11th March, 2024 Andrew Mottram came to talk to us about water; essential need for it to sustain life on earth; we humans can live only a few days without it. Global climate change has led here to a 16 year drought (Mar-May). Years ago Andrew noticed many fish swimming in Norfolk rivers whilst in rivers like the Wandle near London were polluted with no fish. Now the rivers in Norfolk are polluted and water crows foot which grows near clean water, grows no more and the river Wandle is now clean and has fish once more. Therefore, with effort from us change can happen.

Andrew talked about the vast quantities of water needed for industry, like the cheese industry and, of course, agriculture. Farmers are encouraged to grow as much food as possible but 66% of the pollution in the river Wye is from agriculture, the chicken industry is also a big pollutant. Another problem is some sewage plants empty raw sewage directly into rivers and oceans, infecting wild water swimmers, as well as killing river life and environment agencies don't have the money to enforce the rules. Apparently, we are killing insects at an alarming rate and 'SpotOn' to kill fleas on our pets is a 'forever poison' which gets into rivers and is lethal to river life.
