CAMPAIGNS

The Care not Custody campaign is once again very relevant. The Government will be taking important decisions on this in the coming months. The W.I. achieved a huge amount with their campaigning but there is still some way to go. It was seven years ago that W.I. launched a major campaign calling for an end to the inappropriate detention of people with mental health problems. Too many people were being detained in prison when they could have been diverted to hospitals or community based alternatives.



There has been very real progress in the intervening years but we need to keep up the pressure. Therefore N.F.W.I. is asking W.I. members to write to their M.P.s asking them to press the Government for long term, secure funding for liaison and diversion services.

Remember the W.I. have already made a real contribution to this campaign.

RESOLUTION SELECTION PROCESS

Any WI, any Federation or the NFWI can submit a resolution they would like to be on the Agenda for the next NFWI Annual Meeting. These have to be received at NFWI by mid September. In October, representatives from the Federations and NFWI look at all the resolutions and make a short list. This list, with a brief description of each resolution , is then published in WI Life along with a voting slip on which you can select the resolution you would like to be on the Agenda. When making your decision consider which would promote a lively debate, would it call on the Government or WI members to do something, the cost of implementing it and whether others are already campaigning on the issue. Your WI may wish to discuss the resolutions before your Secretary collects the voting slips and sends the results to HFWI in January.

The results are then sent to NFWI and the resolution with the most votes will appear on the NFWI A.M. Agenda. If two resolutions receive nearly the same number of votes they may both be taken. More detailed notes on the selected resolution will be sent to your WI Secretary and also published in WI Life so that you can have an informed debate at your May meeting before your WI votes on the resolution and instructs your delegate how you wish her to vote. For many years, HFWI have held a Resolution Briefing in April with knowledgeable outside speakers who give members more information in support and against the resolution but sadly it had to be cancelled through lack of support. Please let us know if you will support such a meeting next April.
