NEWS FROM NATIONAL

THE FUTURE FOR NFWI JUDGES

Last year, our Federation and I were asked to complete a questionnaire. This was part of a survey conducted by National to establish the current status of NFWI judging. (Cookery, preserves, craft, floral art and Interpretation and staging are the various disciplines)

Both the Herefordshire WI Board and I submitted our responses. Last month, we received notification that NFWI judges are being cancelled from the end of the year with no further judges training, continuous professional development support or maintenance of the 'On with the Show' competitions manual. In addition, we will not be able to wear our badges due to the training no longer being recognised.

Needless to say, a great number of judges are very concerned about this decision and have set up chat groups on social media and WhatsApp. Several flaws have been uncovered in the survey's circulation to judges and federations, but the biggest issue seems to be why this decision has been taken without consultation with WI members. To this end, there will be judges representation at the Annual meeting and we are proposing to petition against the decision for all WI members to sign. If there is no change in NFWI Board's stance, existing judges are keen to retain their status as respected professionals across the many organisations where we are invited to judge, everywhere from a local WI or horticultural show to federation, county and regional events hosted by WI, Young Farmers, Ploughing Societies and others.

The future of judging may currently seem set in stone, and if there is no reversal of the decision to cancel judging, there may be training possibilities outside the NFWI remit to consider. I appreciate I am the only active judge in the county, but I would be grateful for your support in any positive action to save this important aspect of the WI. Educating women is one of the main reasons why the WI was set up in the first place, so this decision blatantly contravenes this aim.

At Last! New Adviser Training

At long last, the all-new revised WI Adviser Training is here! It landed on the WI Learning Hub on May 3rd, and is free to download and to undertake.

There is little doubt that the WI Adviser Training needed an update. It was a huge commitment consisting of two residential blocks and four extensive modules. This all came at a financial cost to federations of course, potentially limiting the number of WIAs a Federation might be able to put forward for training, but the good news is that Adviser Training is now free.of charge so that financial burden has gone,

The new training consists of 7 modules and should take approximately 3.5 hours altogether to complete, which can be done a module at a time in your own time. At the end of each module, you need to complete a short test, and on successful completion of all 7 modules and tests, WI Advisers will receive a certificate of completion.

The new training covers just one aspect of the Adviser role, that of governance, ensuring WIs comply with the organisation's legal constitutional requirements. Financial matters are no longer part of our remit, neither is running training sessions

Now it can't have escaped your attention that currently I am the only WI Adviser in the county and I very much need your help! You can help in two ways.

You could join the Membership Support Team by undertaking the Adviser Training or you could join the Membership Support Team by becoming a volunteer Adviser Helper. This would involve attending meetings with me (for now) to find out the sort of things we do when we visit WIs. Volunteering as an Adviser Helper also gives the opportunity for a person to decide if the Adviser role is for them.

Please do have a think about this and whether you have time to help, or how you can help. A WI Adviser is still the only person who can open, suspend, enlarge or reform a WI. It's a wonderfully rewarding role, if challenging at times, and affords the opportunity to get to know some wonderful people.

Holly Williams a project officer from The Herefordshire Wildlife Trust came to talk to **ASTON INGHAM WI** on 14th May 2024 about rivers, focusing on the river Wye. We heard how climate change has brought environment challenges, biodiversity loss, intensive land management, chemical loss. Since the 1970s there has been a dramatic loss of UK species. 2023 was the warmest year on record since 1850. The global temperature is increasing.

Holly and her team advise farmers on:-

- 1. Better soil management
- 2. Better livestock management

3. Hedgerow and tree planting

4. Creating ponds to increase biodiversity We heard of DEFRA's plans for the river Wye:-

1.Look at a manure plan

2. Develop a 5-10 year catchment plan 3. Restrictions to exporting poultry manure 4. Sustained farming incentive - £35 million for poultry litter incinerators, producing ash which is a rich fertiliser.

5. Macro anaerobic digesters to improve manure management.

6.Grant for slurry stores.

7.Recovery schemes for landscape. Though Holly and her team have done a lot of work on management of the river Wye DEFRA has not consulted them or any other national schemes. Her talk was very informative, if not a little alarming.

The service covers 6 regions with over 6 million people. Helicopters stand by during daylight hours, each carrying a pilot, doctor and paramedic. During darkness critical care cars take their place. And the service is totally funded by contributions.

The competition was for an item connected with flying. Jenny Harrison won with her fascinating entry of "Jupiter" a human powered aircraft flying in February 1972. "Jupiter " was designed by her Jenny's brother.
