
MEMBERSHIP SUPPORT TEAM

NEWS FROM THE ARCHIVES

I have recently been preparing WI records for archiving and am appealing for your help with a number of requests.

If your WI keeps its records on printed loose sheets, please

- Make sure that each sheet is marked with:
 - a. name of the WI
 - title of the record (committee/monthly meeting minutes, committee report, etc.)
 - c. page number in g/n format (where p is the page number and n is the total number of pages)
 - d. date (with four digits for the year)

Otherwise I have to handwrite the missing information on each page which is very time consuming.

Word and Excel both have options in their page set ups for headers and footers where this information can be set up and generated automatically on each page. Please contact me for a template.

- Do not stick the sheets in Minute/Record Books Glue is an issue for long term survival
- Do not use fasteners staples/paper clips/treasury tags
 These are not conducive to long term storage, rust in a surprisingly short time and have to be painstakingly removed
- Do not use punch pockets or other plastic covers
 Plastic has poor aging qualities and these covers have to be removed.
- Print on both sides of the paper to save the planet and space in the archives We are doubling the amount of paper that is really needed.
- Use a smaller font/expand the margins rather than have a few lines on a new sheet of paper
- 7. Keep the sheets in a cardboard folder/envelope i.e. not plastic
