

HOUSEHOLD HINTS

Add two heaping tablespoons of baking soda to the water (or 1 cup of baking soda to 1 gallon of water) until it begins to bubble. For best results sprinkle the baking soda evenly across the pan. Let the silver items soak in the baking soda and water for 30 minutes. Remove the silver pieces from the tray and rinse well.





FOOD FORUM

CHERRY BATTER PUDDING

Serves 4-6 people

The British cherry season is short, but well worth the wait. In Herefordshire there are numerous cherry orchards, so take a trip around this beautiful county and buy your cherries from the farm gate. Just be aware buy more than you need for the recipe, as it is amazing how many are eaten before you get to make your pudding!

Ingredients

- 400gms fresh cherries—wash and dry. Remove stones if you worry about someone swallowing a stone.
- ♦ 75gms plain flour
- 75gms caster sugar
- ♦ 300mls milk
- 2 large eggs—separated
- 25gms unsalted butter
- 2 tablespoons dark rum (optional)
- Icing sugar

Preparation

- Turn on oven 180C/160 fan/gas mk 5
- Place 20cm x 25cm oven proof dish on a baking sheet. Place in the oven to get hot. Approx 4 minutes
- Make the batter—place flour, sugar in a mixing bowl, whilst in the egg yolks and milk to make a smooth batter. In another bowl whisk the egg whites until stiff, carefully fold into the batter.
- Place the butter in the hot dish and allow to melt, roll around the dish until the bottom and sides are covered. Any excess melted butter pour into the batter. Add cherries to the dish and pour over the batter.
 - 5 Bake for 25-30 minutes until well risen and golden brown.
- 6 Serve hot from the oven. Pour over rum if used and dredge with icing sugar.
- 7 Serve with cream or ice-cream.
