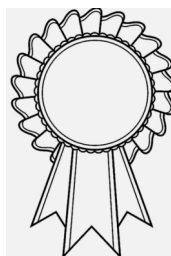

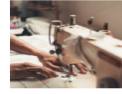

News from the Archives

Many members will be aware of the HFWI publication 'Herefordshire Within Living Memory', a collection of villagers' early reminiscences of life in the county collated by the local WI. Original material for this book, published in 1993, is held in the county archives (HARC) (catalogue references: BF17 and BK 13). My local history society (Bromyard) still has a copy.

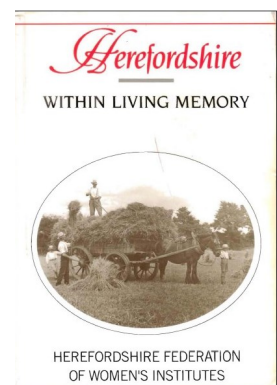
From a report in the Hereford Times, dated 18/6/1954, I discovered that a similar exercise was carried out in 1954/1955 for the Cogan Cup competition reporting announcement of a 'Novel County Competition', sponsored by HFWI. As a sign of the times, the paper believed that, while housewives were busy 'discovering their village ghost, talking to the oldest inhabitants and collecting material for the book', meals would be late, socks un-darned and washing-up left in sinks!

The competition was launched at a county conference held in the Percival Hall in Hereford where Mrs. D. Farquarson provided details of the scheme and plenty of hints on how to approach the task. Entries were to be judged on their ingenuity, not the manner of presentation nor literary style. Around seventy WIs entered the competition which was won by Madley WI.

Apart from one scrapbook held for Walford WI at HARC (catalogue reference: CE50/1), sadly I can find no other record of this research.

For many of us it was a case of déjà vu as once again we found ourselves exercising on the warmest evening of the year! Last year it was Pilates on an unseasonably warm September evening, this year the thermometer had once again reached the high 20s during the day and our hall had yet to recover and cool itself.

Kev began with a few breathing exercises while talking us through some of the history of Tai chi, reminding us that before evolving into a form of mindful exercise Tai chi was once a martial art, designed for combat and self defence. It was lovely to see so many of us participating, ridding ourselves of "the monkey in the tree" (the extraneous things cluttering our thoughts), freeing our minds and enabling us to relax into the session and get the most out of participating.

It was lovely to see so many members in attendance and to welcome several visitors to our meeting who received our characteristic warm welcome and who we hope will join us again.



SALTMARSHE & DISTRICT WI'S September meeting was a presentation by Hilary and Dan from the Hereford independent charity Vennture, who working to support families and individuals encountering challenging life situations. Roots of the charity go back to social reformers John and Emilia Venn in the 1840s who had a philosophy of helping people. This work taken forward in 2013 and re-launched because of a need in the county town and county of Herefordshire; they have connections with the Hope Centre in Bromyard.

Street pastors do shifts from 10pm to 4am keeping young people safe, being guardians against predatory men and helping veterans with PTSD.

Merton Hotel is being transformed into emergency accommodation for homeless people or those needing a safe place.

Volunteers need to be good at listening to find out what people really need and there was an interactive session in which we were invited to comment. Vennture help 120 families a year with 50% of their expenditure is financed by government, for the rest Vennture fundraise.



STOKE PRIOR & DISTRICT WI

Despite depleted numbers due to holidays and illnesses Stoke Prior & District WI had a great afternoon when they welcomed Gisela Lehmann.

Gisela gave a fascinating talk together with a PowerPoint presentation on the Kidderminster Carpet Industry.

LEDBURY WI's demonstrator at their August Summer Afternoon Meeting was Avril Pulley, formerly a china flower maker at the Royal Worcester Porcelain Factory. Her flowers adorn many of the figurines and other artefacts produced over the years. There was no formal training for workers - skills developing slowly with experience. Payment was made on a piecework basis and only items which survived firing were counted. After the demise of Royal Worcester Avril first turned her skills to sugar craft and then to making flowers in air drying paste which she demonstrates at the Museum. It was fascinating to watch as she created such realistic flowers using only her fingers and very simple tools. Jo Butcher generously provided cream scones and Madeleines at the interval. The competition for a small antique was judged by our demonstrator and was won by Chris Joyne with her mother's silver christening mug.



WELLINGTON WI had a fascinating talk by Ray Sturdy and followed it up with an outing to Witley Court. He told us of the house being bought on the proceeds of making nails and metal products and benefitting from the Crimean War. Later a fire destroyed a large part of it and the remaining part was ruined when everything was sold off. We had to see for ourselves.

The house still had elements of beautiful craftsmanship and the gardens were delightful. The fountains stopped us all in our tracks as they played to a crescendo. We completed the outing with a cream tea in the gorgeous gardens and marvelled at the inside of the lavish baroque church. This had been built for the villagers when the owners moved their houses so they couldn't be seen from Witley Court! Great stories and a wonderful afternoon with WI friends.



Meeting of **ASTON INGHAM WI** on 10th September, 2024 Barry Bergman came to our meeting which was titled 'Paint a Picture and Explain.' Barry has been painting professionally for 30 years.

He painted a picture as we watched of The Post Bridge at Dartmoor. It was a Vignette painting i.e. a picture not filling the whole page. Barry used a pen with a bent nib which gave light and dark strokes through the pressure used. He uses carbon platinum black ink and fills in with colour with flicks of a brush - referring to himself as Herr Flick. He drew the paint across to 'fill in' with a brush which made the picture come alive. He said change of light in the painting technique made the ordinary extraordinary.

Barry teaches groups, he says there are sometimes Eureka moments when someone in a group realises he/she can paint.





Over the summer **EYE WI** spent a lovely morning visiting Walenty Pytel's Sculpture studio looking at his wonderful creations, getting a first hand view of his workshops and watching an informative video on how he became a Sculptor and the wonderful commissions he has built.



Later in the summer we enjoyed a friendly, competitive game of Ten Pin Bowling with some of our other WI colleagues and then tucked into a wonderful Steak and Chips supper.



Our final outing has been to Westonbury Mill Water Gardens where we were able to view the Water Powered Cuckoo Clock and two other follies. The weather was kind to us and finally stopped raining just as we arrived at the Garden.

For September's open meeting **LLANGROVE WI** welcomed a local beautician and her willing assistant. There followed a practical demonstration of a wide range of skin care techniques, including LED photo-therapy treatment. Members were shown how to treat and tone one's skin and were informed about the importance of a daily skin routine, especially as one ages and the need to address dryness, lack of firmness and elasticity, collagen breakdown, loss of radiance and dull skin. After such an informative and wonderful demonstration everyone was treated to a cuppa and some delicious treats.



September saw **SPARKLING WYE WI** move to their new venue at Ross Bowling Club. The facilities in the Club House are wonderful. Sparkling Wye WI welcome two new members, Eleanor and Janet and the guest speaker was Dr Ian Hague who spoke about Citizen Science and the plight of our rivers, in particular the Rivers Lugg and Wye. Sparkling Wye WI's Secretary informed members that she would be receiving water testing kits from WaterBlitz and required volunteers to test the water in the Wye as part of River Action week. During the evening members voted for the winner of the Campaign Cup. The entry from Lindsay Cole was the winner—well done Lindsay.
